3. Band - a ring/ a musical group
4. Lead - to guide someone (to go first with followers)/a type of metal
5. Bat - an implement used to hit a ball / a nocturnal flying mammal
6. Bright - very smart or intelligent / filled with light
7. Current - up to date / flow of water
8. Die - to cease living / a cube marked with numbers one through six
9. Express - something done fast / to show your thoughts by using words
10. Fair - equitable / beautiful
11. Jag - a sharp, juttred object / a crying spree
12. Kind - type / caring
13. Lie - to recline / to tell a falsehood
14. Match - to pair like items / a stick for making a flame
15. Mean - average / not nice
16. Ring - a band on a finger / something circular in shape
17. Right - correct / direction opposite of left
